**POCERP:** The Professional Officer

Early Release Program allows active duty enlisted personnel with two years of college remaining to apply for early release from active duty to pursue a commission through Air Force ROTC. Applicants must be:

- A U.S. Citizen.
- Have a grade point average of 2.0.
- Take the Air Force Officer Qualification Test and score a minimum of 15 Verbal and 10 Quantitative.
- Must not turn 35 before returning to active duty as a second lieutenant.

**ASCP Program:** The Air Force ROTC Airman Scholarship and Commissioning Program offers active duty Air Force enlisted personnel the opportunity to earn a commission while completing requirements for an undergraduate degree as an Air Force ROTC cadet.

Air Force ROTC offers two types of scholarships. Type I scholarships pay full college tuition, incidental fees, plus a textbook allowance. Type II scholarships are capped at \$15,000 per year. Air Force ROTC cadets on scholarship receive a \$150 monthly nontaxable allowance during the school year. Applicants must be:

- U.S. Citizen, under the age of 27 as of June 30 of the year in which commissioned as an Air Force Officer (waiverable).
- Have one year of continuous active duty service (waiverable).
- Have been on station for one year (waiverable).
- Have a recommendation from your immediate commander.

Applicants must meet the minimum cu-

mulative grade point average for graded college course work. If applicants have less than less than 24 semester hours or 36 quarter hours of graded college course work, then high school GPAs and SAT/ACT scores will be reviewed. The AFOQT exam is required.

For information on the POCERP or ASCP programs, call the Community Education Center at 963-4573 by Dec. 1. Deadlines for completed applications are due to HQ AFROTC/RRUE by March 15.
