



June-July CAFB justice files

Airman confined for viewing child pornography on gov't computer; airmen use official travel credit cards to make personal phone calls

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Courts-Martial

A senior airman was found guilty by a Special Court-Martial for failing to obey a lawful order to have no contact with another service member, for filing a false travel voucher for expenses associated with an evacuation incident during Hurricane Floyd and aiding and abetting another service member in filing a false travel voucher. She was sentenced to six months confinement, reduction to E-1, and forfeiture of \$600 per month for six months.

An airman first class was found guilty by a General Court-Martial for receiving more than 200 images of child pornography, failing to obey a general regulation for processing and displaying obscene images on a government computer, desertion and misuse of his government Visa charge card. He was sentenced to 34 months confinement, reduction to E-1, and a bad conduct discharge.

A senior airman was found guilty by a Special Court-Martial for being drunk while on duty, and for filing two partially false travel vouchers: the first voucher was for expenses associated with evacuation during Hurricane Floyd, and the second voucher was for a deployment to Panama. He was sentenced to four months confinement, reduction to E-3, and a fine of \$600.

Article 15 Actions

A senior airman failed to report to duty on four separate occasions.

Punishment: Suspended reduction to E-3, 30 days extra duty and a reprimand.

An airman first class changed his failing body fat measurement to a passing measurement on his Health and Wellness Center Body Fat Measurement document. In the processing stages of his Non-Judicial Punishment, he was stopped at the Rivers Gate for Driving Under the Influence. A Breath Alcohol Content Test was administered, and the individual's breath alcohol level registered at .14.

Punishment: Reduction to E-2, suspended reduction to E-1, 45 days extra duty and a reprimand.

A technical sergeant was derelict in the performance of his duties when he failed to follow technical orders, which required him to inspect dangerous conditions indicated by a red

"X," and sign-off on an Air Force Technical Order Form 781A once the inspection was completed. He had another airman complete and sign-off on the inspection.

Punishment: Reprimand.

An airman first class failed to report to duty on two separate occasions.

Punishment: Reduction to E-2.

An airman first class used a government PIN number to make personal long distance telephone calls in the amount of \$108.01.

Punishment: Suspended reduction to E-2, and a reprimand.

An airman first class used a government PIN number to make personal long distance telephone calls in the amount of \$158.91.

Punishment: Suspended reduction to E-2, forfeiture of \$200 and 15 days extra duty.

An airman first class used a government PIN number to make personal long distance telephone calls in the amount of \$481.01.

Punishment: Suspended reduction to E-1, 14 days extra duty, and a reprimand.

An airman used a government PIN number to make personal long distance telephone calls in the amount of \$226.17, and signed an official statement stating that she had stopped using the government telephone pin number when, in fact, she continued to use it.

Punishment: Suspended reduction to E-1, forfeiture of \$200 and 30 days extra duty.

An airman first class used a government PIN number to make personal long distance telephone calls in the amount of \$60.94. She also signed an official statement stating that she gave the government telephone PIN number to only one other military member, when, in fact, she had given the number to other people.

Punishment: Suspended reduction to E-2, forfeiture of \$200 and 30 days extra duty.

An airman first class used a government PIN number to make personal long distance telephone calls in the amount of \$54.67. She also signed an official statement stating that she gave the government telephone PIN number to only one other military member, when, in fact, she had given the number to other people.

Punishment: Suspended reduction to E-2, forfeiture of \$200 and 30 days extra duty.

An airman drank alcohol under the age of 21 and threw a beer bottle through a dormitory room window, causing \$319.47 worth of damage.

Punishment: Suspended reduction to E-1, restriction to CAFB for 14 days and 14 days extra duty.

A senior airman unlawfully touched another military member on her hair, back, and buttocks with his hand, and orally communicated to the military member certain indecent language.

Punishment: Reduction to E-2, suspended reduction to E-1, and a reprimand.

A staff sergeant was derelict in her duties when she failed to take notes during counseling sessions at the Charleston Naval Brig. She was ordered to complete the notes, yet failed to do so.

Punishment: Suspended reduction to E-4, 30 days extra duty, and a reprimand.

A senior airman failed to go to his mandatory appointment at Family Advocacy.

Punishment: Reduction to E-3, 30 days extra duty, and a reprimand.

An airman first class stole a fellow airman's credit card, and used it to buy \$323.02 worth of goods and services. She also made a false official statement to her first sergeant when she told him that she found the airman's charge card.

Punishment: Reduction to the grade of E-2, 30 days of extra duty and a reprimand.

Vacation Actions

An airman first class received an Article 15 for failing to report to duty on time. His punishment was a suspended reduction to E-2 and 14 days extra duty. The punishment was later vacated for writing a bad check to the CAFB Exchange in the amount of \$200.

An airman first class received an Article 15 for failing to report to duty. Her punishment was a suspended reduction to E-2, restriction to CAFB for 30 days and 30 days extra duty. The punishment was later vacated for making a false statement about an unpaid balance on her Deferred Payment Program card.

Remissions

An airman first class received an Article 15 for using a government PIN number to make personal phone calls. His punishment was a suspended reduction to E-2, forfeiture of \$200 for one month and 15 days extra duty. The punishment was

later remitted for good behavior.

Administrative Discharges

An airman first class was discharged for a mental disorder. His disorder was so severe that his ability to function effectively in the military environment was significantly impaired. The member was separated with an honorable discharge.

An airman was discharged for unsatisfactory performance. He received a number of counselings and Letters of Reprimand, as well as an Article 15, a vacation action and a referral evaluation performance report. The member was separated with a general discharge.

An airman basic was discharged for unsatisfactory performance. He received a number of counseling sessions, a Letter of Counseling, three Article 15s, a referral EPR and four Armed Forces Traffic Tickets. The member was separated with a general discharge.

An airman basic was discharged for unsatisfactory performance. He received a number of counselings and LORs, as well as two Article 15s, a vacation action and an unfavorable information file. He was also arrested in Georgia for driving under the influence of alcohol, speeding, no proof of insurance and a suspended driver's license. He was separated with a general discharge.
